



## Federal Court Maintains Humanitarian Parole

A Federal Court maintains President Joe Biden's humanitarian parole that offers immigrants opportunities to remain in the United States for humanitarian reasons. The humanitarian parole initiative is a key element of the Biden administration's immigration strategy.

This immigration policy applies to immigrants from countries such as Venezuela, Nicaragua, Cuba and Haiti. To participate, immigrants must fill out an online application, find a financial sponsor in the United States and arrive by plane.

Approved people receive a stay of two years and are eligible for work permits. This process has facilitated family reunifications and allowed immigrants to enter the workforce, and many have quickly found success in their new communities. Can I Get My Papers Without Leaving The Country?

In order to settle within the American territory, certain factors must be met. Mainly they are the following:

Another way to arrange papers is through American citizen children, but here it is necessary to specify that the person must not have any other immigration violation, because otherwise the process would be complicated.

Papers can also be arranged through law 245-i, only for people who are within the eligibility. Here it does not matter which family member submits the request, any family member can do so. Another option to arrange papers is through an American citizen wife or husband or an American citizen child who in turn belong to the military or are veterans.
